

### **Inclusion Services**

Inclusion services create an opportunity for people with disabilities to participate in the least restrictive environment and be included in our Member District recreation programs. Inclusion provides support and education while it addresses the abilities of people with disabilities in their chosen recreational pursuit. These programs consist primarily of preschool, before and after school programs, holiday programs, sports, fine arts and summer camps. In 2014, M-NASR helped 237 individuals to participate in 981 of their municipality's traditional recreation programs.
